We are a LOGOS church. We are committed to helping children and youth grow in faith and become disciples of Jesus Christ. We make that happen by encouraging and inviting many adults to be a part of the LOGOS program. We know – from experience – that a Christian life is about building relationships based on love, trust and faith. LOGOS is all about building relationships.

LOGOS is about EATING! We have great meals and wonderful cooks to prepare them! Every dinner hour has a theme, prayer, food and games. Children sit with their table families during the dinner hour and build relationships based on nurture and nourishment.

FOCUS OF THE LOGOS PROGRAM

A saving relationship with God through Jesus Christ is more important than anything else in life. Therefore, nurturing people, especially youth and children, into right relationships of faith through Jesus Christ is the most important thing the church ever does.

Sociological factors influence and motivate people more than theology. Therefore, youth and children must be given sufficient opportunity to center their friendships in church-based relationships.

The Christian faith is more caught than taught. Therefore, spiritual nurture always requires a relational context to be effective.

Definition: LOGOS is grounded in biblical theological concepts. The word “ LOGOS ” literally means “The Word” and is taken from John 1:1- 18 *“In the beginning was the word..... and the word was made flesh, and dwelt among us....”*

The 4 parts of LOGOS are shown in this key Bible verse: “They devoted themselves to the apostles’ teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers.” Acts. 2:42

LOGOS is an international program and has been in existence for 47 years. At SPUMC, it includes grades 1-12 and is designed to nurture loving, Christ centered relationships. It is an opportunity to consistently experience and practice Christian relationships with children, youth and adults as taught in Scriptures.

LOGOS is not a substitute for, or replacement of, other programs of Christian education. Rather, LOGOS is another area of Christian education and a strong supplement to those programs, which are enhanced, extended and improved through the contribution made by the LOGOS program. Youth involved in LOGOS are encouraged to attend church school regularly and participate in other youth and family programs at church. Participation in LOGOS helps our children find a peer group at church and makes them eager to see their LOGOS friends at other church functions.

LOGOS offers its participants the positive aspect similar to summer camp, but on a weekly basis. In the context of a disciplined and structured program, young people enjoy Christian fellowship through:

1. Creative recreational activities
2. Participation in worship skills
3. Group study of contemporary and Biblical values
4. Sharing a family-style meal



LOGOS also provides an opportunity to explore one’s identity in a Christian environment. Pastors, other church staff, and congregational leaders can become friends as well as mentors and teachers.

PROGRAM –

Grades 1-6

The program for grades 1-6 includes 4 areas of study and experience... **Recreation, Worship Skills, Bible Study, and Family/Dinner Time.** Regular attendance at worship services is an expected part of the program as well.

Grades 7 & 8

With these older middle school grades, we start to transition to more of a “youth group” atmosphere. One big change we are trying this year is to have the 7th & 8th graders eat together in the Pop Machine Room. Their Bible Study and Recreation times are brought together in a one hour and fifteen minute segment, often trying to bring a rec game or activity that corresponds to the theme they are talking about in Bible Study. This time is spent discussing topics pertinent to adolescents in the world today. Their Worship Skills time includes a choice of age-appropriate activities offered for these youth.

Grade 9

This is the confirmation class. Please contact Reverend Susan Bresser, 837-5554, for information on the confirmation program.

10th – 12th Grade High School

The high school program includes a separate dinner for the high schoolers, study and fellowship. This age group discusses relevant issues and how teens can live Christ-centered lives in today's world. This age group has 6 committed leaders who are with the youth the entire evening, allowing them to have group discussions, as well as break out into smaller groups for some discussion time. They also plan, prepare and present 3 entire Worship Services, thereby including Worship Skills in a way that is not only meaningful to them, but gives them a chance to share their faith with the congregation. They have also gone to a Summer LOGOS Youth Conference for 5 years now, the last 4 in Estes Park, Colorado.

DISCIPLINE AT LOGOS

With over 100 youth & children in our building on Wednesday evenings, it is necessary to have a formal discipline policy. At all times we remember that the root word of 'discipline' is 'disciple'. Our goal with discipline is to nurture respect for all of God's people.

We will be using a "Three Strike" policy, using these steps. When observing a negative behavior, the leader will talk to the child and reinforce the LOGOS rule "Everyone will treat everyone else as a child of God. No one will treat anyone else as if they do not matter." The second step is to remove the child from the class and have him/her talk to one of the "Comforters". The ministry of the Comforter is to listen to the child, help solve the difficulty, and encourage a recommitment to the rule of LOGOS, in order to return to class. The child may remain with a Comforter until s/he is ready to return and participate. The third step is to contact the parents when the child has been unwilling/unable to treat others as children of God.

There is only one rule at LOGOS:

**EVERYONE IS TO TREAT EVERYONE ELSE
AS A CHILD OF GOD.**

**NO ONE HAS THE RIGHT TO TREAT
ANYONE ELSE AS IF THEY DO NOT MATTER.**

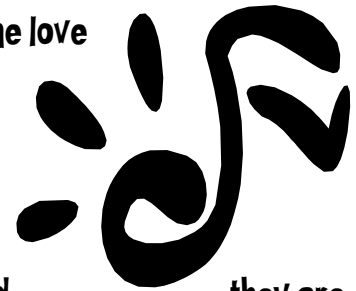
RECREATION



Recreation frees children and adults to be themselves, surrounded by Christian love. People develop relationships while playing that wouldn't develop otherwise. It is designed for youth and children to experience great fun at no one else's expense. Children and youth participate in games, crafts, sports, hobbies, and service projects.

WORSHIP SKILLS

Worship is central to the Christian faith. Teaching one another about the love of Christ is incomplete without providing opportunities to participate in worship. LOGOS students will participate in worship periodically in a variety of ways.



If your child's class is scheduled to participate in a worship service and they are not able to be there, it is important for you to call their worship skills leader or coordinator to let them know. Families who worship regularly with another congregation are expected to join Sun Prairie United Methodist Church on those dates that their children participate in our worship services.

This year, again, we have two exciting musicals that we will be presenting to the congregation! The first will be a Christmas musical "The Christmas Story" and will be presented between worship services on Sunday December 6th. We will be doing this jointly with the Church School classes. The second will be "Simple Gifts" and we will be presenting this on March 20th and 21st at the 5:00 Saturday and 10:45 Sunday worship services.



BIBLE STUDY

The goal of Bible Study is to nurture youth into intelligent, obedient and Biblically informed discipleship. The Bible Hour is a time for building bridges. During Bible Study we strive to build a bridge of relationships between God and god's people, and among God's people; a bridge between ancient words of scripture and the world of the learners today; a bridge between weekends and a bridge between the church and the home.

FAMILY/DINNER TIME

The dinner hour is full of fun and great food! Usually 5-6 youth of various ages sit at the same table all year. At their table are 2 table parents who do their best to establish a family atmosphere. The result is great as kids and adults learn to appreciate one another. During dinner kids will sing, play and be challenged to know the God who loves them. Dinner Time includes training in unselfishness, sharing, cleaning up, serving one another, and manners too. Good food, table games, and contests are just part of the fun!

Library Supervision Before and After LOGOS

Please note that the libraries will be open and supervised by volunteers from 4:30 – 5:15 and from 7:30 – 8:30 if your child arrives prior to, or stays after, his/her session of LOGOS. Under Safe Sanctuaries, children and youth will not be able to be in the library earlier than 4:15. If your child will be spending time in the library please have them bring homework or reading material, and remind them that they should remain in the library when not in LOGOS activities. It is vital that they stay in this supervised area.

Nursery

The LOGOS program provides childcare for any LOGOS Volunteers who have children too young to enroll in the program. **Parents may only use this service when they are working in the program and are in the building.** Kids eating in the nursery are asked to pay \$2 per meal or \$20 a semester. Due to large numbers of children in the nursery, kids who are 4 years old by September 1st through Kindergarteners are encouraged to attend Cherub Choir and Preschool Bible Storytime if the parent is volunteering at those times.

The nursery will be staffed with volunteers from 4:30 – 8:00, and later if there is need. If you will be needing nursery care after 8:00 please let Theresa Guelker know in advance.

VISITORS

Visitors are welcome at LOGOS! After visiting two times, parents will need to formally register their child for LOGOS and set up a parent meeting with Deb. Please consider the outreach ministry that can happen through this program and thoughtfully encourage your children to invite their unchurched friends.



PARENT PARTICIPATION



The LOGOS program enables parents to fulfill a portion of the basic responsibilities set by God for them in the raising of their children. Young people recognize the value of something when a parent makes a commitment to it. They know their parents time is important. They know they are important when a parent says "I am doing this because I love you and this is important for you."

Active participation by at least one parent (or other loving adult, if the parent is unavailable) is required. Since the staff is mainly voluntary, additional volunteer service by a large number of people is essential to keep the many activities going. This is a vital element in the successful operation of the LOGOS program.

At the time of registration, one or both parents should sign up to volunteer where they feel called to participate. A variety of volunteer opportunities are available – talk with Deb to see which is the best fit for you.

DINNER GUESTS

The cost of dinner for all adults and non-registered children visiting during dinner time is \$5.00 per meal, \$1.00 for children in the nursery. Please call Deb by Tuesday at noon if you will be bringing a guest so that we can plan accordingly and have a place set.

Snow Policy

If Sun Prairie Schools are cancelled, we cancel LOGOS. In case of bad weather predicted for late afternoon or evening, we will watch weather reports and cancel, if necessary. If we are cancelled, we will send out an email by 1:00 p.m. on Wednesday. We will also have it listed on the answering machine at church. If you would like to receive a text message, please let Deb know early in the year. If LOGOS is not cancelled and you are coming from communities other than Sun Prairie, always do what you are comfortable with. You and your child's safety is our main concern. If you are not able to come, please call the LOGOS office at 837-5554 ext. 107 if you do not feel comfortable driving.

TRANSPORTATION



Car pooling is encouraged and should be arranged by parents. If you need transportation for your youth or can provide transportation, please indicate so on your registration form and talk to Deb as soon as possible. The LOGOS

Transportation Coordinator will work with the parents as much as possible to help each student obtain needed transportation. It should be noted, however, that it is the final responsibility of the parent to ensure that the student gets to and from LOGOS. **If the student is not picked up by the driver, the LOGOS office should be called immediately at 837-5554 x 107. Please let your childcare provider know this.**

Need to get a hold of Deb on a Wednesday?

I am at church all day Wednesday – not at home. Please do not leave a message on my home machine. Call church at 837-5554 ext. 107.

Need to get me on a Wednesday evening? Call MY church extension – 837-5554 ext. 107 and leave a message. If you do not dial directly to my extension, it goes on Laura's voice mail and will not be retrieved until Thursday morning. Even if I am not back by my desk, I check messages all evening. Or you may try my cell phone – 575-1465. If I am able to, I carry my cell phone with me during LOGOS.

Check in and Check Out

According to our Safe Sanctuaries policy, everyone 3rd grade and under needs to be checked out of the building from children's programming. Parents need to indicate on the registration form who is authorized to check your child out each night or you may authorize your child to not be signed out each evening. If you authorize your child to go out to your vehicle alone, we need the children to remain in the entry way until they see the car pull up and you signal to them to come out. There are a LOT of vehicles coming and going on Wednesday evenings and in the dark, cold, snowy weather, it is dangerous for children to be waiting in the parking lot alone.

We have some changes in check in and check out:

- We will be checking IN children 1st – 3rd grade this year. Look for the binder on the front table.
- We will be requiring IDs of people you have authorized to pick up your children. (listed on the registration forms) when checking out kids 3rd grade and under.
- 1st and 2nd graders who are picked up after their LOGOS evening is finished (6:45) need to be picked up at their dinner table. (Adults still need to show an ID and check out their children at the door) Any 1st and 2nd graders not picked up will be escorted by a Table Parent down to the Children's Library. Parents who arrive after the dinner hour is finished may pick up their 1st & 2nd graders at the Children's library until 7:30.

Drop Off

According to the church's Safe Sanctuaries policy, kids or youth may not be dropped off before 4:20, as they may not be left in the building unattended.

Registration Deadline for LOGOS is September 20th

If you have NOT had children in the LOGOS program before, a parent meeting is mandatory.

- There will be a Parent Meeting at the Christian Education Picnic on Sunday, August 30th and you may register then. Come after church, lunch at 11:30 at Wetmore Park, across from the church parking lot. Bring a salad or dessert. This is the best opportunity for you to learn about LOGOS as well as ALL Christian Education Opportunities open to children and youth in grades 1-12 this fall at SPUMC.

It is a requirement that all children and youth in LOGOS have a parent or other adult volunteer with this ministry. There are many opportunities available, some weekly, some bi-weekly, some monthly and some at other times than Wednesday evenings. At this picnic, you will have the opportunity to hear about these options and talk to someone about using your gifts to help out in an area you will find fulfilling.

- If you can not make the Christian Education Picnic, we will have another LOGOS Parent Meeting for parents new to LOGOS on Wednesday, September 9th at 6:30 at church.
- If you are not able to make it to either of the parent meetings, please call Deb at 837-5554 ext. 107 or email me at rduhner@charter.net so we can set up a time for an individual parent meeting.

If you had children in LOGOS last year:

- You may register and attend the Parent Meeting at the Christian Education Picnic on Sunday, August 30th at Wetmore Park across from the church. Come after church, lunch at 11:30. Bring a salad or dessert. See other LOGOS families you may not have seen over the summer! This is the best opportunity for you to learn about LOGOS for each age group (your children are growing!) and some changes we have made this year. We will also have information on all opportunities for children and youth in grades 1-12 this fall.
- You may also register online. Go to SunPrairie UMC.org and under "LOGOS" click on the registration link, print up the registration form and mail it or drop off at the church with payment by September 20th.

REGISTRATION FEES

The LOGOS year runs from October 7 – March 24 and is divided into 2 semesters. Included in the fee is a new LOGOS t-shirt and canvas LOGOS bag for each child. If finances are a concern, partial scholarships and alternate payment plans are available. Talk with Deb before the due date if this is a need. Tuition per semester is:

Volunteer Staff Meetings

LOGOS Staff Meetings are held twice a year, including parents who volunteer at LOGOS. The purpose of these meetings is to discuss questions, concerns and changes that naturally occur in the course of a program year. Guest speakers and videos may be a part of these meetings. The 2 staff meetings scheduled for this year are:

We will go over LOGOS and how it works at SPUMC in detail. You will also have a chance to meet with your area coordinator to get more information on your part in LOGOS. Supper is included. To make reservations for dinner or childcare, call 837-5554 ext. 107 or email rdmulhern@charter.net You will need to bring a sack supper for children in the nursery.

Note: If you have not had Safe Sanctuaries Training in the last 3 years, you will need to attend one of the trainings. There is one held at 3:00, right before the LOGOS Staff Training. You will receive more information on this in the mail with details as to how you can become trained.

Wednesday, January 27, 2010

Common Questions about LOGOS

My child has too much homework. What should we do? We usually make time for those things we count as important – priorities need to be established. If you consider that you will be eating dinner, whether at church or at home, LOGOS demands are not extravagant. In the past, I have talked to my sons' teachers and they have always been willing to work out a solution that works. However, if it remains a problem, talk to Deb and we can work out a solution.

Does every child need to go to worship skills? Yes. This is a way for each child to learn various ways to give personal service to God and the church.

Can't we do away with dinner and save time, trouble, and money? To have only part of the program destroys the essence of its success. Eliminating any part of the program diminishes its importance and success by over one-half. The value of LOGOS is not the activities offered, but a total program of growing relationships.

What about Church School and Worship on weekends?

This is actually the 5th part of LOGOS. Worship is the heartbeat of the church. Attendance is expected at church school and worship as often as possible and especially when Worship Skills groups participate.

I work late and cannot easily help. What should I do? There are many areas where help is needed at different times. We can help you work out a volunteer assignment that fits your schedule and interests.

Can my neighbor, who belongs to another church, join? The program is open to all children in the community. However, it will be occasionally required for children to attend worship services at Sun Prairie United Methodist Church. They will need to attend when their worship skills class is leading a part of the worship service at SPUMC.

Doesn't this compete with Church School? NO! In most churches where the LOGOS program is used, the tendency has been to enhance other Christian education systems. The children come to the church as closer friends and with a better background to add to class discussions.

How important is it for my child to be in worship service? Very!! We feel the weekend worship experience is central to your child's spiritual growth. We will expect them to be present.

Does my child have to attend all four parts of the program? Yes! All four parts are interdependent and make an essential contribution to the success of the whole.

What else can I do to help my youth in LOGOS?

Insist on regular attendance in the program and in worship; particularly those services in which your child will be leading a part of the worship.

Be sure your child brings his/her Bible to class each week (3rd grade and up).



Fulfill your volunteer commitment of LOGOS service. Volunteer staff members are working for their Lord in committing this time for the development of young people; and you, by giving of your time, can render a vital service to our children.

Arrange for prompt payment of fees.

When your child is scheduled to lead in worship, it is important that you help your child fulfill this commitment by getting him/her to church and rehearsals, if scheduled, on time. If your child can't be there, please call the Worship Skills leader or Coordinator.

Participate in and encourage daily Bible reading and family devotions at home.

Stress the importance of courtesy and good behavior at LOGOS.
